



Rama Navami at Rameswaram

Rameswaram is linked to the epic Ramayana, where Lord Rama worshipped Lord Shiva to seek divine blessings before embarking on his battle against Ravana. The temple here is known for its sacred waters, and the Ramanathaswamy Temple has one of the longest corridors in India, offering a peaceful and spiritual atmosphere for pilgrims. 


